

in building a new Advanced Manufacturing and Software Technology Center (AMSTC) in Van Buren Township.

Immelt said he believed that Michigan could partner with GE "to create the next wave of economic progress."

He added in a news release issued on the same day that "Michigan is a great location for a technology center because of its world-class engineering, technical talent and public officials who understand that investing now will create tomorrow's leading positions in information technology, clean energy and transportation."

The new GE AMSTC opened its doors in October 2009, having launched an initial recruiting campaign for about 1,100 hires. By mid-January 2010, the Center had reportedly attracted 18,000 job applications. underscoring Michigan's then unemployment rate of close to 15 percent.



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
