Maybe until you're around them in a group, one forgets just how quiet the Chevrolet Volt -GM's plug-in, hybrid electric vehicle, really is.

This all became notable because Chevrolet had treated 50 local Volt owners to an ice cream social at the Radisson last week, on the Tuesday evening prior to the Dream Cruise.

With the 18th annual Cruise long being known for squealing tires and loud horsepower emanating from jacked-up engines and dual-chrome exhaust pipes, well, the appearance of a Volt fleet en masse - silent sentries parading down the drag ever so gently, neatly and keenly.

The Volt ice cream social was actually the formal kickoff of four days worth of organized activities by Chevrolet, which is in the second year of a three-year overall sponsorship of the larger Woodward Dream Cruise.

"The Woodward Dream Cruise is a true celebration of America's love affair with the automobile and the open road, and for Chevrolet it is an opportunity for us to connect with some of our most passionate customers and their families," said Chris Perry, Chevrolet global vice president of Marketing, in a blanket press statement describing why the brand is now so closely aligned with the Cruise.

Although the casual, informal parade of silent Volts down Woodward was perhaps a harbinger of things to come for the future of the auto industry, nostalgia nonetheless reigns supreme when it comes to the Dream Cruise and the social and pop cultural mythologies associated with it.

Besides the ice cream social on behalf of the Volties, Chevrolet was all over the lower half of Woodward, one might say.
