Even in his senior years, Lieberman teaches and coaches athletics with children who have autism, he teaches seniors from ages 70 to 102, he teaches people with disabilities and he's going to be teaching at an area senior citizen's home that is brand new.

"I'm going to be teaching there starting after Jan. 1," he said.

He's involved with Kids Kicking Cancer, a charity that supports youngsters with cancer, and he says they might make him their nationwide spokesman.

They couldn't have asked for a better champion. Lieberman's long and varied career has been one of constant giving. He's done everything in his life from teaching black-belt level karate to marketing projects with former Detroit Piston and industrialist Vinnie Johnson.




