The 2013 Nissan Altima makes it easier to maintain air pressure in your tires. Just connect the air tube to the tire, and the Easy-Fill Tire Alert will chirp the horn once the tire pressure reaches the recommended setting. The alert also works when a driver lets the air out of an overfilled tire. Wi-Fi Hotspots – Chrysler currently offers a \$505 Uconnect Access upgrade to the 2013 Ram 1500's infotainment system. The package adds a Sprint 3G cellular modem, which provides a Wi-Fi hotspot for multiple devices up to 150 feet away. Uconnect Access will also be available on the 2013 SRT Viper and the more affordable 2014 Jeep Cherokee. And by 2015, General Motors plans to equip most of its models with a 4G LTE modem that will also provide even faster Wi-Fi hotspots. Hydrophobic Windows – A steady downpour can make it difficult to see out of your car. But what if the drops just beaded up and slid right off the car's windows? This technology is already available on the specially-treated side windows of the 2014 Kia Cadenza. The technology improves visibility in rainy weather and makes for easier drying after the car is washed.

Then at noon. the RM Auctions sale begins, featuring an array of highcaliber classic and other collectible automobiles for sale. Admission to the preview is free of charge, while admission to the auction is restricted to qualified media, consignors and registered bidders. Bidder registration is \$200 and can be completed in advance of the sale at rmauctions.com or on site at the event.

On Sunday, July 28, the 35th annual Concours d'Elegance begins. It starts at 10 a.m. and goes until 4 p.m. General admission tickets are \$25, and include free parking, shuttle service and a program book. Children under the age of 12 get in free. For info, visit www.concoursusa.org.
